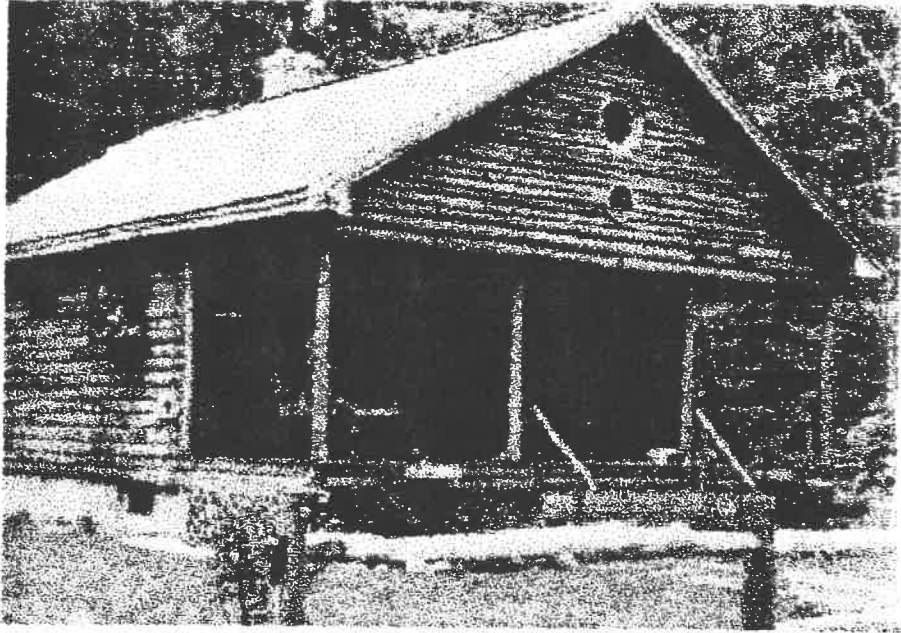

Few individuals have had such an impact on the West End House as did Mike Cataldo. As a youngster, he was very active at the Club in the West End of Boston and at the Camp in Maine. After serving in the Navy in World War II, he became heavily involved in the House and Camp affairs. He served on the Board of Directors of the Camp Corporation, Alumni Association, and House (Boys & Girls Club) Corporation, served on and chaired many committees, and eventually rose to become President in each of these three respective organizations.

At Camp he served for over three decades as co-chair with Joe Kaplan of the West End House Camp Committee. He took frequent trips to East Parsonsfield, attended countless meetings, made many phone calls, and wrote innumerable letters.

He never missed an Old Timers' Week, Camp Breakfast, House Reunion, WEH affair. He spoke passionately about the West End House, and next to his family, he loved us the best.

We truly loved him; he had been such an important part of the West End House picture for so many years that we really thought he would always be there.

At the end of January 1999 Mike Cataldo succumbed to cancer. It was a great loss to his family and friends, and to all of us at the Camp and Club. People of his dedication and generosity do not come into our lives every day, and we shall always cherish his memory, his kindness, his support, his friendship, and his wise counsel. He was one of the giants in our history.

ABOUT THE COVER

Almost two years ago the Camp Committee began discussions about a new building for camp – one that would serve as an office or administrative building. We were very fortunate that one of the members of the Committee, Mike Finn, made the very generous offer of subsidizing half of the costs; close to the other half was pledged at the Old Timers' Week Fundraiser in the Council Ring in August 1999.

As a result of research by Billy Swiecicki, we are pleased to announce that the building will become a reality for the 2000 camping season. Interestingly enough, the style of the building is called "The Kezar," which may or may not be related to the name of our neighboring town, Kezar Falls! When we heard that name, however, we knew the building was meant for us!

"The Kezar" will serve as an office, visitor center, and "headquarters" for a canteen. It will be located just to the right as you enter camp, and just behind cabin 4B. The sonic tubes (on which the cabin will be placed) have already been put into the ground. (This is the first new structure since 5A and 5B were built in 1961.)

Our deepest appreciation to Michael Finn for his generosity, and to Billy Swiecicki for his research and efforts in ensuring that we will have the best possible new facility anywhere!


Message from the Waterfront Director
