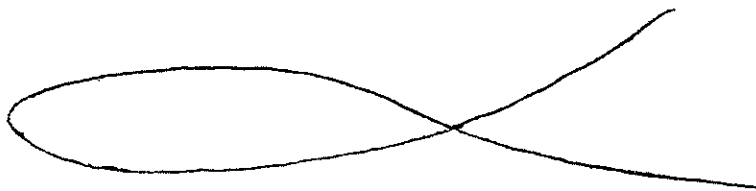
For the first time in the history of West End House Camp, the White team has won Color War for three consecutive years.
