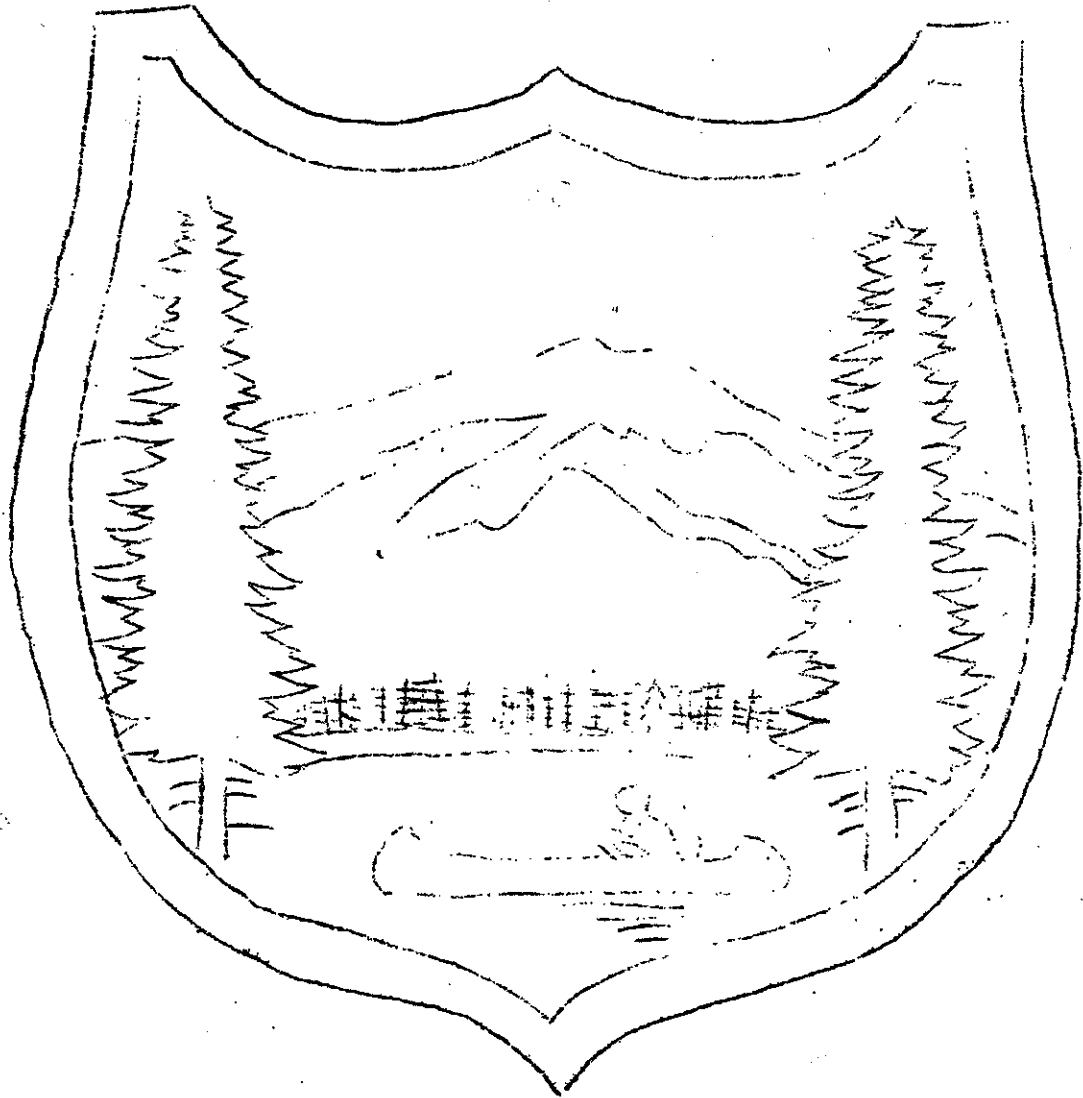

A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

West End House Camp was started on its present location in 1908. From the original eighteen campers, it has grown to one hundred and thirty campers in residence at any one time. The tents gave way to the log cabins; the "wash rock" to laundry boxes mailed home; the raft gave way to an H Dock. So it goes on. Change is an essential part of the Camp's growth and continued existence.

The reasons for the continued existence of West End House Camp are firmly rooted in the basic values of camping:

It is a creative, educational experience in co-operative group living in the out-of-doors.

Through supervised activity, sufficient rest, good food, and wholesome companionship, camping contributes to good health.

Camping contributes to social development by providing experience in which campers learn how to deal positively and effectively with living situations.

Camping contributes to the development of self-reliance and resourcefulness by providing experience and instruction in which campers acquire knowledge and skills essential to their well-being.

Through camping, the boy is exposed to new experiences in an environment quite different from his every day life. He has been temporarily separated from parents upon whom he usually depends. He is a member of a small unit in a close guidance relationship with his counselors.

The camper is an important source of future Camp leaders. Thus, through a wholesome camp experience, both the Camp and the boy are additionally rewarded.

The degree of success of West End House Camp is, to a great extent, a reflection of the quality of its leadership. There can be no compromise on the quality of the staff. The staff must have a realistic understanding of society and particularly of the social forces which influence boys.

No matter what a camper brings to Camp in the way of life experiences, he should carry away with him renewed faith in himself as a person with dignity; new skills in athletics and feelings about his camping experience which will enrich him in what we call "the Spirit of West End House".

To the present staff, I say "thank you" for the hard work which has resulted in so many boys and young men attaining the objectives mentioned above.

To the campers, I say "thank you" for enriching my life. . . .
God Bless You. Have a good school year, and I'll see you next year.
