THE HISTORY OF THE SPIRIT

This is the twenty-first issue of the Spirit, the yearbook of the West End House Camp. It all began in 1958 when Howie Levine put out the Camp's first yearbook. He returned to publish a second issue in 1959, thus establishing the tradition of having the Spirit. For 1960 and 1961, Neal Andelman was the editor. It was in 1961 that Neal Andelman wrote that the word "Spirit" stood for "Spirit Plus Integrity Run In Tradition". In the next three years, Bill Margolin served as the editor of the Spirit. First year CIT Fred Rapoport ran the whole show in 1965, and from 1966 to 1969 Dana "Crabin Hood" Jackson published the Spirit. Bill Margolin returned as editor in 1970 and 1971, making him the editor of five issues- the most of any Spirit editor. When Bill became Program Director, his assistant editor, Howie Wynn, became the editor of the 1972 and 1973 Spirits. All of Gottlieb got together on short notice and published the 1974 issue with first year CIT Dave "Beast" Barenberg coaxing them along. Jeff "Solly" Solomon ran the presses in 1975 and 1976. It is interesting to note that Jeff is Neal Andelman's nephew, thus making them the first two members of the same family to put out the Spirit. In 1977, another first year CIT, David Goldman, was on hand to run off the twentieth issue of the Spirit. Finally, in 1978, Jeff Solomon returned after a summer away from the Camp to the editor's desk. In its twenty-one year history, the Spirit has had nine different editors, and has become a very important part of the West End House Camp.

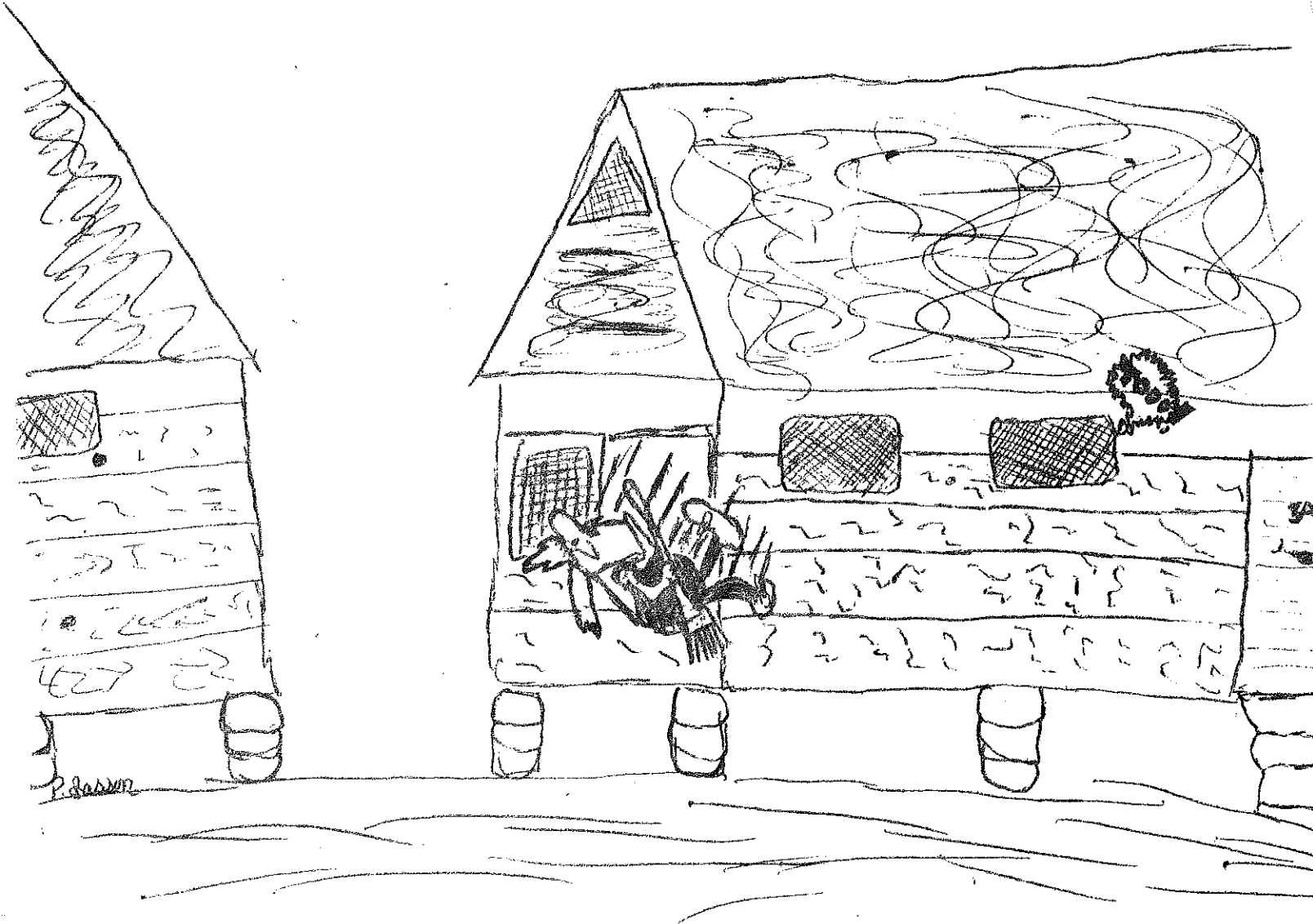

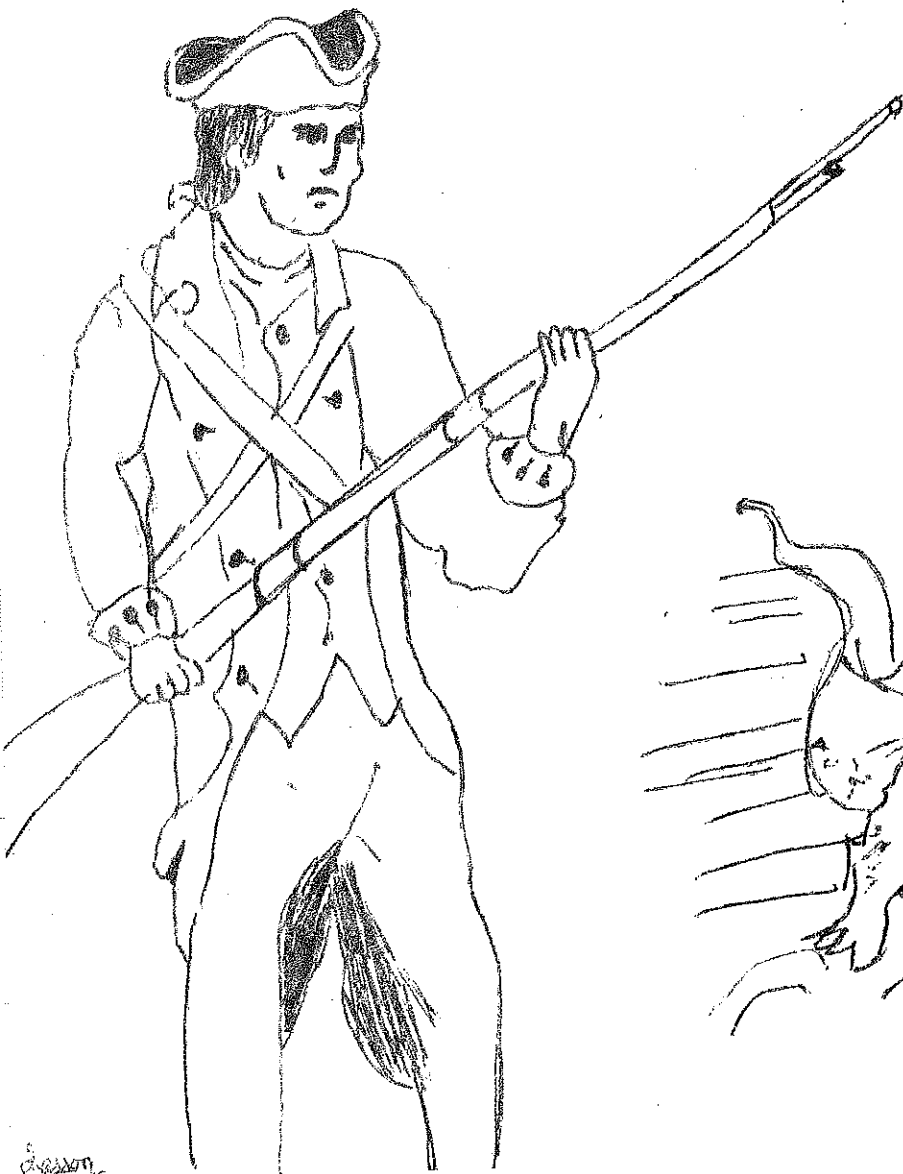

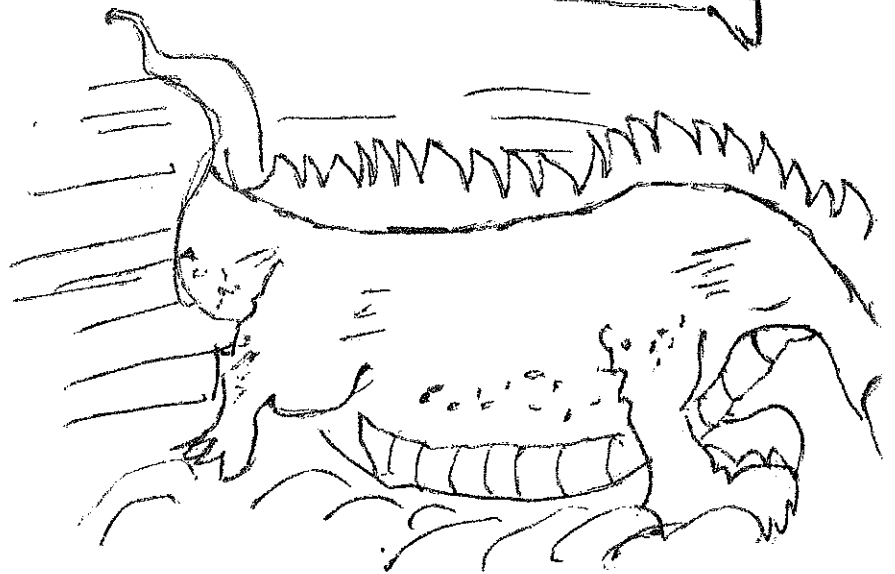

WEST END HOUSE CAMP SONG SHEET

The original House song, written about 65 years ago by a composer unknown to us, was made popular by the late Jack Burnes, former Executive Director of the West End House. He was at that time the "assistant superintendent" of the House, a position that today would correspond to assistant director.
