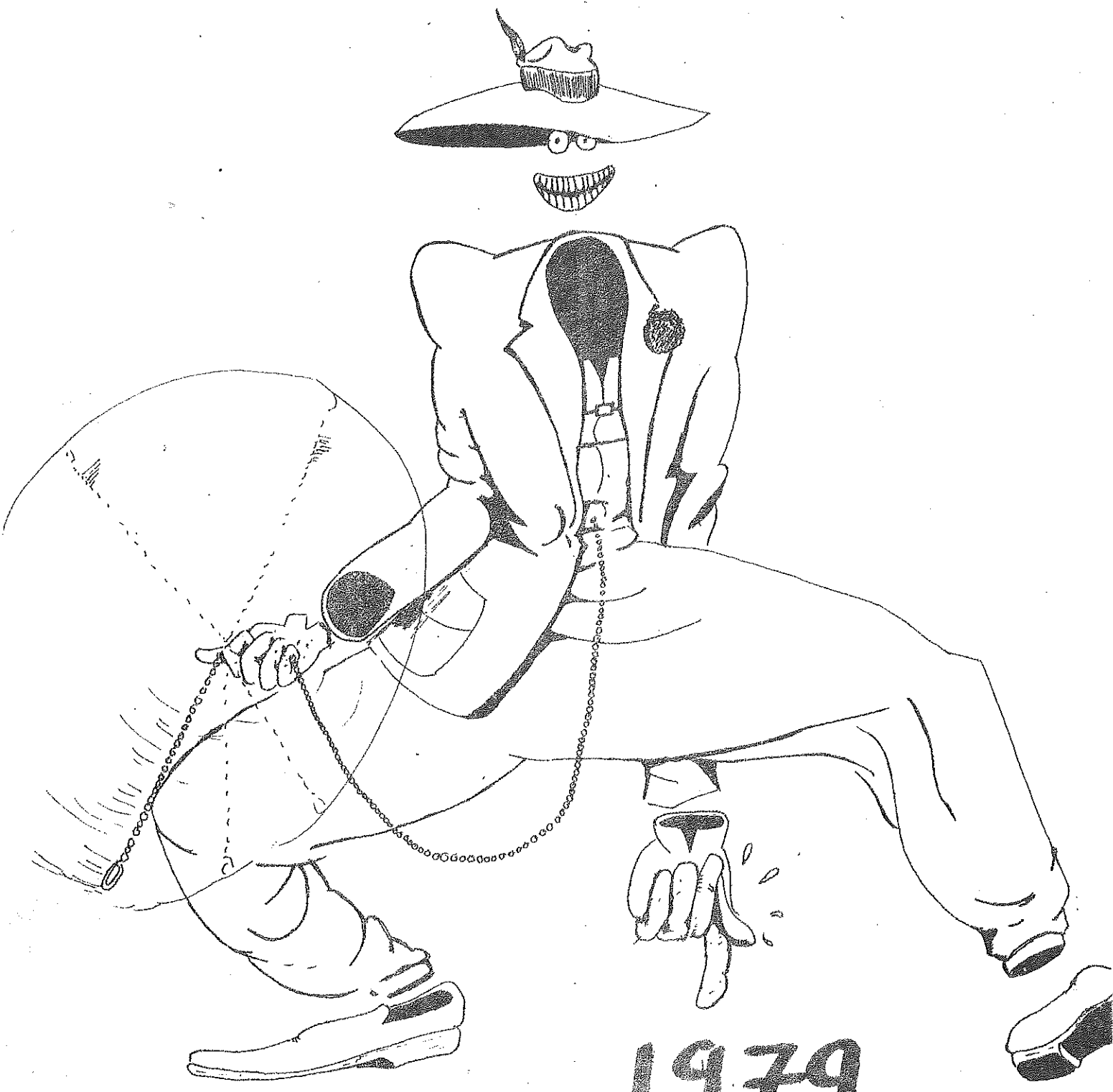

The Club remained in the West End of Boston until the late 1960's, when urban redevelopment of the area caused us to relocate to the Allston-Brighton area of Boston. Our \$1.6 million building boasts an Olympic size swimming pool, varsity size gym, games rooms with pool and ping pong tables, arts & crafts, weight lifting, Library, karate, boxing, and meeting rooms. Also, it has girls!

The WEH Camp began in 1908, and for over 70 years has provided the finest in camping experiences to thousands and thousands of youngsters. Both the Camp and the House are members in good standing of Boys' Clubs of America, and our Alumni Association (over 1,000 strong) is the largest and most unique from among the other 1,000 Boys' Clubs in the United States. We are a private, non-profit organization, depending on contributions and endowment funds to survive. We welcome support from parents of campers to help us overcome our annual deficit.

Jeff Solomon has labored long and hard in order to produce this Spirit for 1979. He has done an excellent job - accomplishing a week's work in two days. Congratulations, Jeff!

Thanks again to all - I'll look for you at the West End House during the coming months, and certainly at the Reunion we are planning during Christmas Vacation. Try to make it - it will be great seeing you again and talking about the good times we had together this summer.

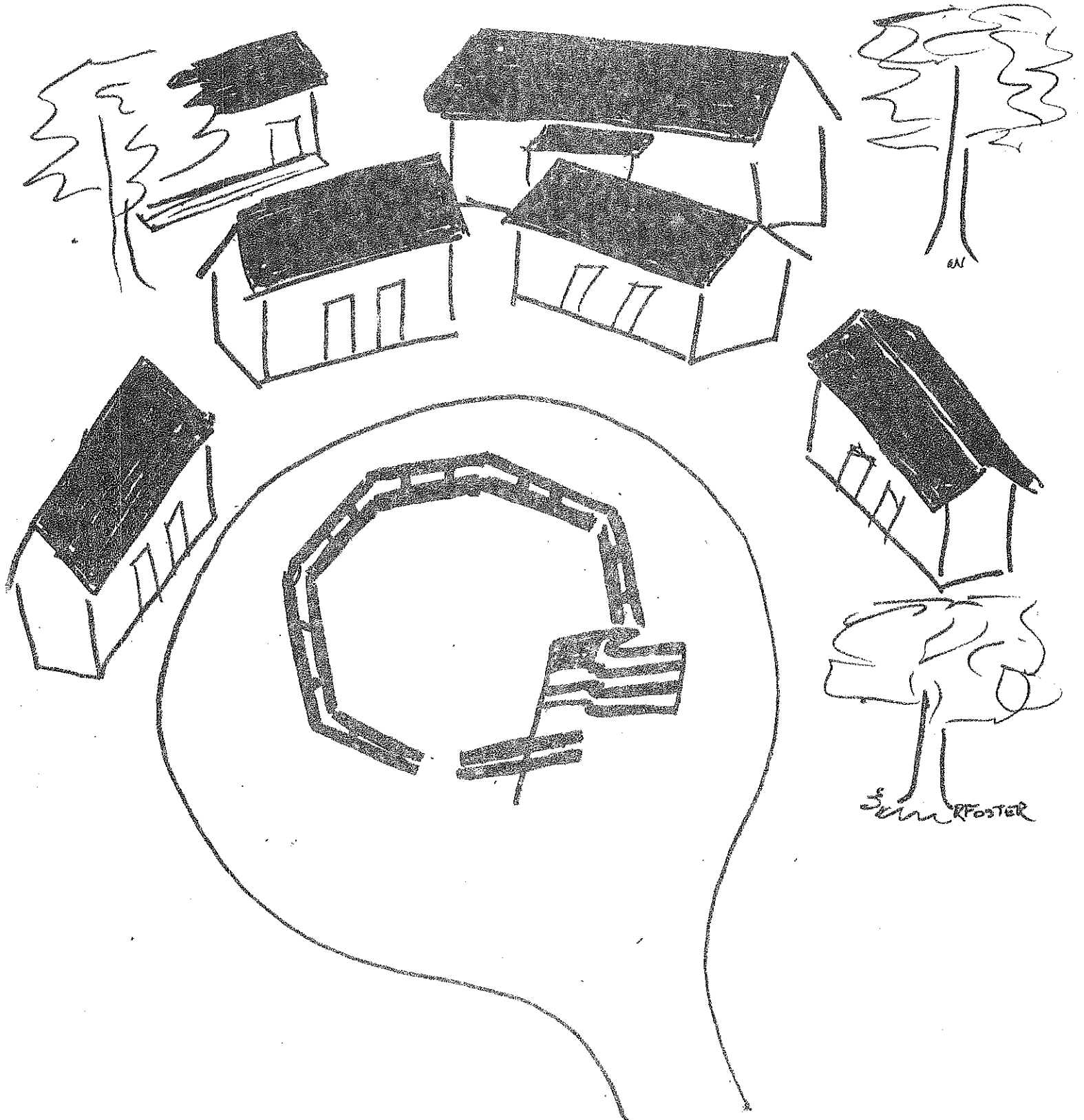
#### SWIM TEAM

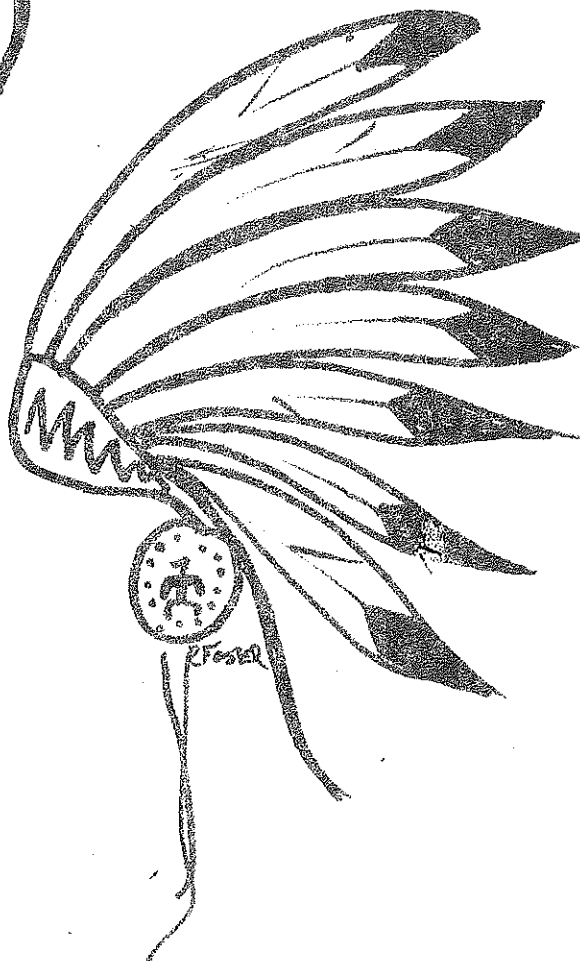
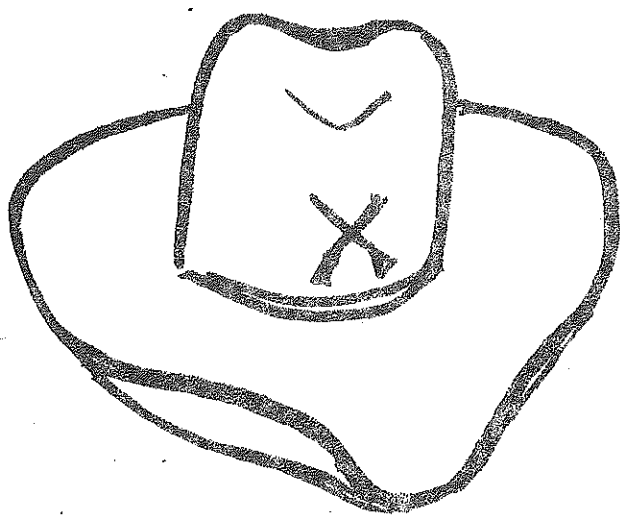
