DEDICATION

Louis Kane had been part of the West End House since his very birth almost seventy years ago. Following in the footsteps of his father (George), Louis took a very active interest in the organization from early childhood, including many years spent at the West End House Camp.

Louis Kane was a graduate of Harvard, served as an officer in the Marine Corps, and was a successful businessman (he headed up Au Bon Pain). He was a well known figure in Boston, New England, and, indeed, the country. He traveled extensively, and work took up so much of his time.

But Louis Kane never forgot his roots – he served for decades as a member of the Board of Directors of the West End House (Boys & Girls Club), the West End House Alumni Association, and the West End House Camp. He became an officer – and eventually President – of all three corporations at different times. He gave of his time, efforts, and resources in a generous and unselfish manner, and he was always available (despite a hectic schedule) for consultation by phone, a meeting in person, or a conference with others. He never missed a visit to the Camp, and spearheaded the efforts each Old Timers Week to raise funds in the Council Ring for both the Camp and the Club. He very much believed in the West End House and all that it stood for.

He arranged for Au Bon Pain to become a major contributor to local, regional and national Boys & Girls Club conferences and meetings. His own personal efforts and those of his company were recognized on numerous occasions with awards from the National Office of Boys & Girls Clubs of America, including the Service to Youth Award and the Bronze Keystone Award for extraordinary service to children.

Louis Kane passed away in June at his summer home in Ogunquit, Maine. At the time of his death, he was the Immediate Past President of the West End House Camp and Chairman of the Board of the West End House Boys & Girls Club. His brave struggle with his illness and his untimely passing were the cause of great sadness for his family, for the West End House, and for all who knew and loved him. We will always remember him as a tireless, vibrant, and caring family man, benefactor, leader, and friend.
