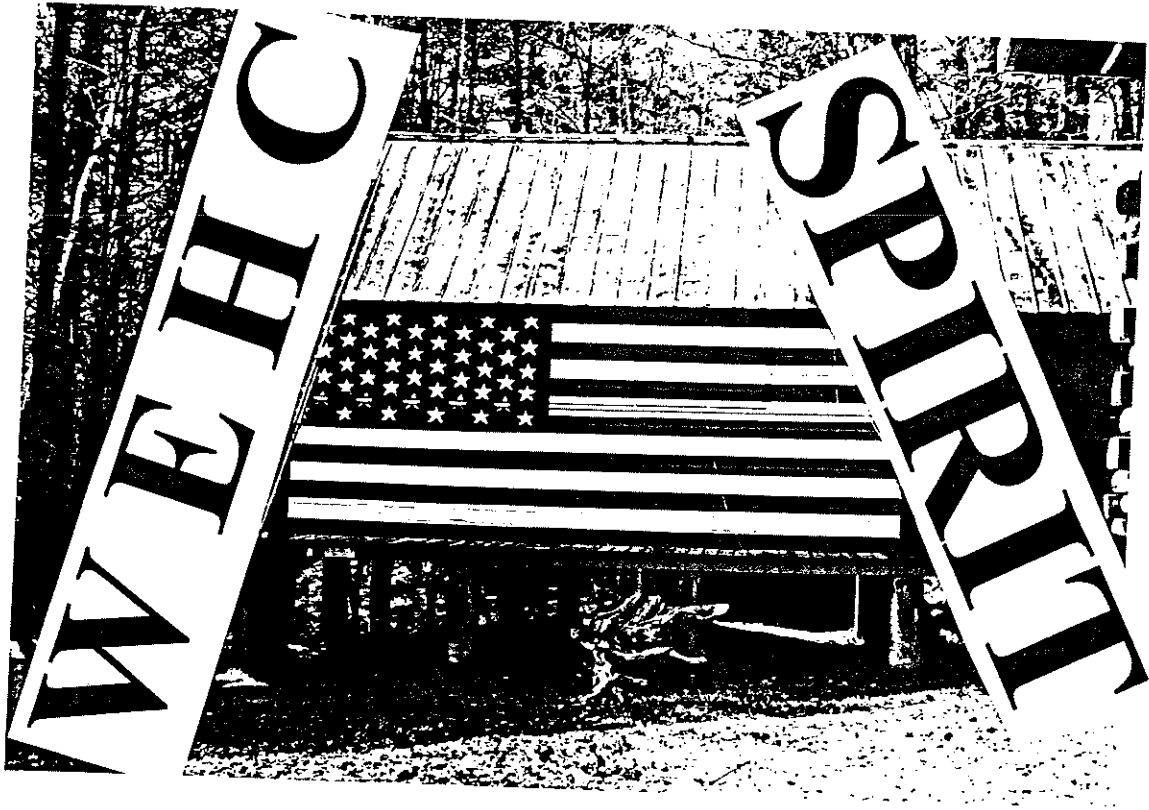

The West End House lost two long time and loyal members during 2001, individuals whose efforts on behalf of the Camp and Club have had a profound and positive impact on the lives of the thousands of children we have served at both facilities.

Max Feld died during the summer at the age of 93. He was a lifelong WEH member and supporter, served on the Alumni Board through many decades, and was elected President of the WEH Alumni Association during the 1950's. Max also served on the WEH Camp Committee and Camp Board for many years – including long time chairmanship of the Camper Selection Committee and membership in the Camp Coordinating Committee. Despite his advanced age, Max always maintained a keen interest in events occurring at the West End House and always kept in touch.

Allan Romanow passed away in November at age 87. He, too, was a lifelong member and supporter of the organization, a Camp Director in his younger days, a member of the Corporate Board, Camp Board, and Alumni Board for many years, a Past President (in the 1970's) of the Alumni Association, and sponsor of the Bertha and Alan Romanow Endowment Fund. He did not let illness slow him down, and to the end actively continued to advocate for the West End House and to attend meetings and functions. The poem read at his funeral urged those in attendance – indeed, all of us – to “carry on.”

Yet, despite the loss, we still advanced into the semi-finals against Camp Winaki. Our ace, Tomás Farrell, took the mound for us in this game. WEH was trailing 4-2 in the bottom of the fourth inning when a foul ball was hit to our catcher, Mike Jacobs. After he CLEARLY caught the ball, the umpire ruled that he dropped it. This caused our team to become rattled and the inning continued. We ended up giving up 4 more runs that inning, and eventually lost the game 9-3.

Week Five consisted of the annual home game against Camp Manitou. Even with a couple of our players on the disabled list due to sickness, and with many new young players playing in their first game for West End, our team was ready to go. Manitou is an ALL baseball camp. However, our team played very well defensively - including the spectacular play of Jason Harris, Tomás Farrell, Yonas Mellese, Max Finn, Kerry Reef, and Brian Handell. Lonnell Wright pitched a strong five innings - allowing 6 runs. He was relieved by Tomás. Competing against a tough Manitou team, we ended up on the losing end of a hard fought 7-4 battle.
