DEDICATION

George Kane has been a member of the West End House for well over 85 years! He had already been active at the West End House Boys' Club prior to attending WEH Camp for the first time in 1919. Indeed, he has attended camp virtually every year since then!

Mr. Kane is a remarkable man who has dedicated his efforts in an extraordinary manner to assuring that the children of our organization enjoy the very best in services that we can offer. In the late 1940's he spearheaded the fundraising campaign to modernize the camp, to build cabins, the dining hall, and the gymnasium, to develop the waterfront, and to clear land for playing fields. In the late 1960's and early 1970's he again was at the forefront of raising money, this time to build a brand new club in Allston (after WEH moved from the old West End section of Boston). For the past few years he and his family have once more been magnanimous in their efforts to secure funds for the club for the purpose of the establishment of a new third floor of the renovated club — the Louis I. Kane Youth Leadership Center, named in memory of his late son.

Mr. Kane has worked tirelessly for the West End House his entire life, not only raising funds for the Camp and the Club, but also serving as President of the West End House Camp, West End House Boys' Club (as it was known originally), and the West End House Alumni Association. He remains active to this day as a member of the Corporate Boards of both the Camp and Club.

At Mr. Kane's 90th birthday party in January 1995, he spoke of his first trip to the West End House Camp in 1919. He reminisced that when he first saw the lake (Long Pond) in East Parsonsfield, his heart skipped a beat as he realized the beauty of this place and the wonderful opportunity that was afforded him to attend this facility. He concluded his remarks by stating that every year since then he feels the same emotion when he passes the lake and enters the camp. It is a feeling that we all share to varying degrees, but none with more emotion, history, and perseverance than George Kane.

On the occasion of his 99th birthday on January 1, 2004, and in humble gratitude for his remarkable efforts in the past, present, and future on behalf of the children of the West End House, we respectfully and lovingly dedicate the 2003 Spirit to
