

Ian Greenblatt was a young man who was very much part of the West End House Camp family. He lived in Ashland, Massachusetts, and although he initially attended WEH Camp as a young boy with other friends from that town, he quickly became friends with countless other kids from all over the country. His warm personality, sincerity, and leadership abilities were but some of the outstanding attributes that endeared him to everyone he met.

In 2000, his last year as a camper, he was a Co-Captain of the Blue Legion, and from 2001 through 2003 he was on the Camp staff.

Wherever Ian went he was popular, whatever tasks he undertook he did so with the commitment to succeed. As a staff man, as a Color War coach, as a friend, and as a person he was great and great to be with – always with a warm smile and a twinkle in his eye.

That twinkle was extinguished as the result of injuries suffered in an automobile accident on Father's Day Weekend 2004 in New York City. He had just recently celebrated his graduation from Rivers and was looking forward to attending Colgate University in New York in the fall. He left behind his parents, his sister, grandparents, and countless hundreds of friends whose presence at his funeral was a tribute to the lives he had touched in his all too brief 18 years of life.

A number of funds and memorials were established in memory of Ian, including the Ian Greenblatt Spirit of the House Award. Beginning with the 2004 camp season, this award will be presented to a Junior and to a Senior who best represent the outstanding spirit and dedication exhibited by Ian Greenblatt.

ABOUT THE COVER

In 1950 the "new" West End House Camp was dedicated on a warm Sunday afternoon with many hundreds of people in attendance. George Kane, who turned 100 years of age on January 1, 2005 and who is still very active with the West End House organization, spearheaded the fundraising efforts in 1949 and 1950 and chaired the committee whose work resulted in the building of a modern camp that replaced the tents of the previous four decades. This photograph pictures campers, parents, WEH Alumni Association and Auxiliary members listening to an invocation in the gymnasium, after which they were seated for the ceremonies.

This was the original gym, which was destroyed in the winter of 1952-1953 as the result of one of the most severe ice and snow storms ever seen in Maine. It was a huge building, and on that day had about 350-400 people in it to listen to the dedication ceremonies.

The current gym, built in 1956 to replace the fallen structure, was constructed with iron support beams to prevent any possibility of history repeating itself!

MESSAGE FROM THE ASSISTANT EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

First of all, I would like to thank Danny Barr, Program Director, who was more collaborative, mature, organized, and effective than ever. Secondly, the informal "Executive Council," consisting of the key senior leaders of camp met with Bill, Danny, and me to ensure that we were all on the same page and that we were giving the proper messages and leadership to the entire staff. Thanks to Robbie Gordon (Senior League Commissioner), Josh Swiecicki (Junior League Commissioner), Jeff Berger (Waterfront Director), Mike Gordon, and Evan Lepler, who eagerly participated in these efforts.

No one seemed to notice the unusually poor weather. They were too busy having fun, hanging with their friends, and feeling good about themselves and each other. MESSAGE FROM THE WATERFRONT DIRECTOR

In the tradition of the West End House Camp, the proverb "If it's not broke, don't fix it" is often followed to a tee. However, after much discussion last spring with Danny Barr, it became my intention to evaluate each waterfront program and make changes to them accordingly. This task proved to be more difficult than I expected, but as a result of a devoted and excellent staff, it became much more possible.

There is no question in my mind that the 2004 staff was the best that I have seen in my 11 years at camp. As I reflect today, five months since summer ended, there are so many people I would to thank for making the summer such a successful one. For starters, I would like to thank the Assistant Waterfront Director, Marc Balmazi. If it where not for him, I probably would have quit halfway through the summer. I also would like to give a special thanks to Dan Liebman, whose devotion to making the summer successful is unparalleled. One of the main goals at the start of the summer was to use both motor boats at all times. We were able to do this in large part because of Tommy Kandler, who was always willing to help in any way possible, whether it was teaching swim classes or changing the Malibu's oil. The waterfront had an extremely experienced and qualified staff with Marc Balmazi and me as both WSI's and lifeguards, along with Tommy Kandler, Andre Fredette, and Jason Cohen as certified lifeguards.

Michael Jacobs did an outstanding job of combining instruction in canoes, rowboats, kayaks, and sailboats into one program. The archery program would not have been possible without Kenny Ng and David Kaplan, both certified archery instructors. This has long been one of the favorites for campers in the Junior Division, but it would not have been possible without the hard work of both of them.
