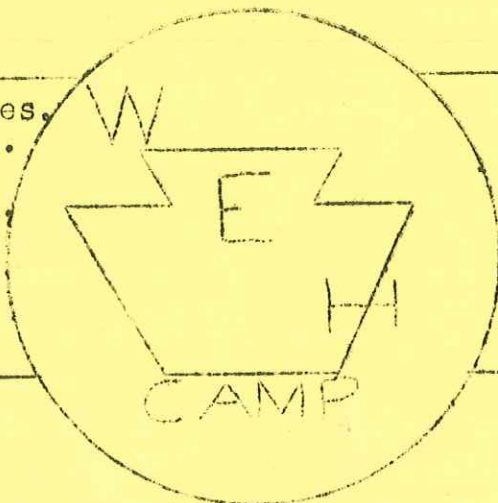

APACHE RELAY RUNS CAMP RAGGED
