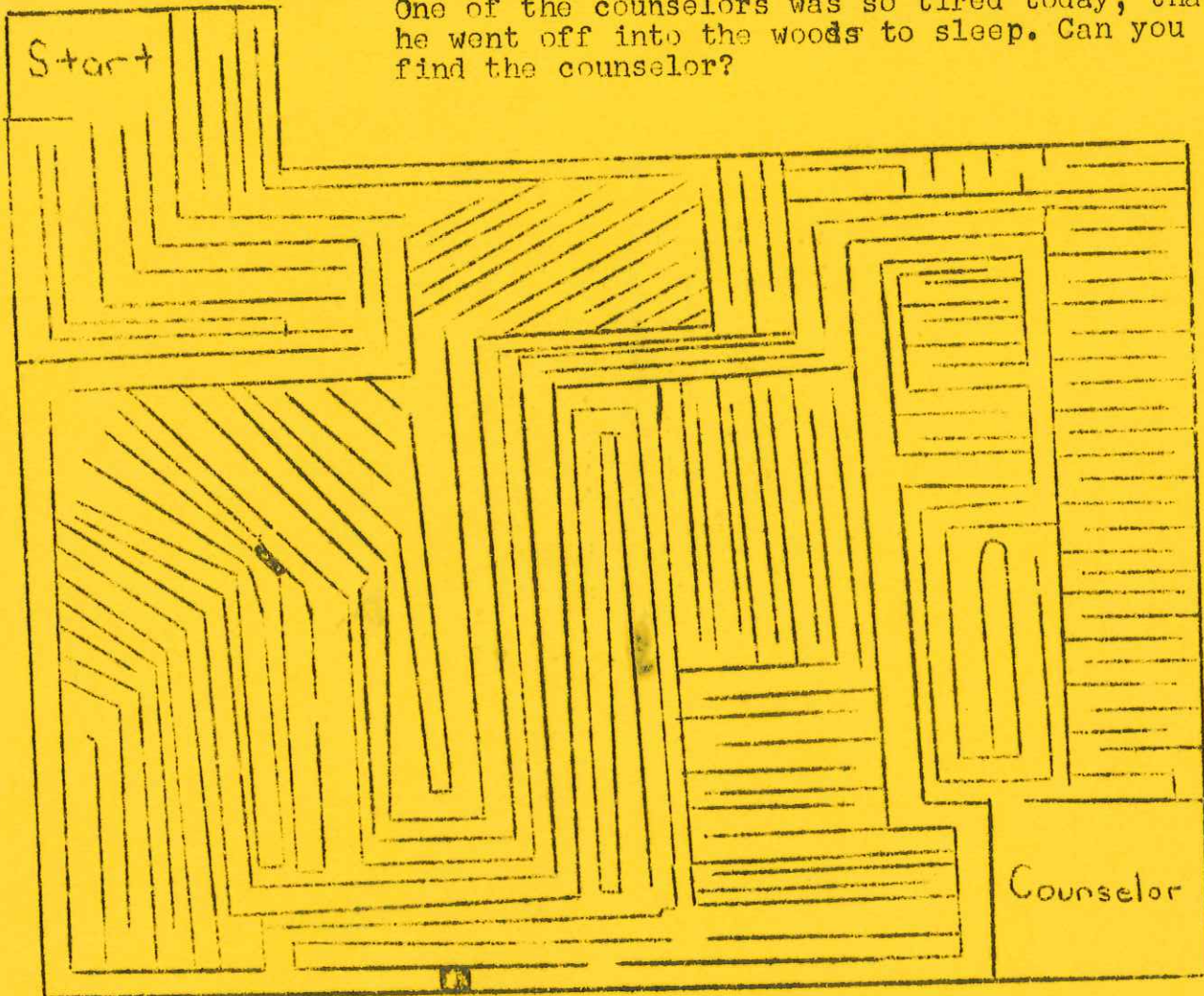
## (Archery Meet - con't)
